Our Mission

The Senior Nutrition Program strives to maintain and improve the physical and social well-being of older persons by providing regular nutritious meals daily, Monday through Friday, at convenient sites throughout Butte, Yuba & Sutter Counties.



The Community Action Agency is a non-profit organization providing multiple services to low-income and elderly residents throughout Northern California.

Senior Nutrition

Senior Meals offers a nutritious, well-balanced, noontime meal Monday through Friday at designated sites, plus a chance to meet and spend time with others. Home delivered meals are available to those who are ill or disabled.

All persons 60 years of age and older and their spouses may participate. There are no income guidelines that must be met to participate. Individuals under 60 years of age are welcome, however, a \$5.00 per meal fee is required.

There is no mandatory fee to participate in the senior meal program if you are over 60 years of age, we do suggest a \$2.50 donation each meal to help defray expenses. Many who participate are unable to make any donations; some contribute much more. Transportation to the dining centers is available in most areas. Please call (530) 538-7158 for information.

Meals are served Monday through Friday (except for Agency holidays) at dining centers located throughout Butte, Yuba & Sutter Counties. Special programs and entertainment are often scheduled before meals. Call the center near you for reservations as they are required.

A main dish, vegetables and/or salad, fruit or dessert, and milk are served consisting of 1/3 recommended daily allowance for seniors. Each month the menu plan is reviewed by a certified nutritionist to assure the Agency is serving nutritious and well-balanced noontime meals.

Food Bank

The Agency administers a North State Food Bank in a five county area, including Butte, Glenn, Colusa, Plumas and Sierra Counties. Surplus foods are distributed to qualified individuals and families once a month in various locations throughout the counties. This program is funded in part by the United States Department of Agriculture. Individuals and families who are within 150% of the poverty guidelines are eligible to participate in the program. Participants self-certify eligibility on the day the surplus food is distributed by showing proof of income and address.

The Agency operates the North State Food Bank as a part of America's Second Harvest the Nation's Food Bank network. Surplus food is donated by large providers and distributed throughout the country via a network of affiliated food banks. The Agency serves our area including Butte, Glenn, Colusa, Plumas, and Sierra Counties.

The Agency operates North State Food Bank from its Oroville warehouse through a network of volunteers committed to easing hunger and increasing food security of low-income households. New initiatives including Farm to Family are intended to bring fresh produce to households to improve nutrition and health as well as combat obesity.
