The Housing and Community Development Department strives to provide education, home energy improvements and emergency utility services to help reduce low-income resident’s home energy costs.



The Community Action Agency is a non-profit organization providing multiple services to low-income and elderly residents throughout Butte County since 1967.

Home Improvement

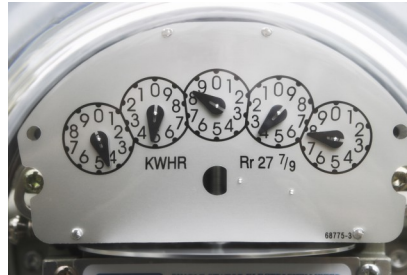
Since 1979, the Agency has provided home energy saving programs that are federal and utility company funded. Services are provided to eligible low-income clients in Butte County with limited services in surrounding counties.

Typical services includes installing insulation, reducing air infiltration, performing tune-ups and repairs or replacement to heating and cooling systems, replacing appliances and replacing incandescent lighting with compact fluorescent bulbs.

Other services include door weather-stripping, new windows and doors, low-flow shower-heads, ceiling fans and many other energy saving measures. Weatherization technicians use energy audits to determine which energy measures are most appropriate and cost effective for each home.

Weatherization reduces energy costs for low-income families. It improves the safety and efficiency of their homes. Weatherization returns \$1.80 in energy related benefits for every dollar invested in the program.

Utility Assistance

Utility Benefits Payment Program provides energy educations and utility payment assistance to income qualified residents of Butte County. This includes assistance on electric, natural gas, wood, propane, and fuel oil expenses.

Solar

The Agency can install Solar Hot Water Heater Systems at no cost to income qualified households. Saving following theses installation on monthly bills range from 15% to 25% per household.

Rehab & Construction

The Agency develops affordable housing for low to moderate-income families. The Agency has built in different communities using financing from varied public and private sources.
